Session 1 (9:00-10:00) The Bible as Literature and Rhetoric, Part 1

A high view of Scripture says that God inspired both the content and the form of his Word. And a high view of preaching says that heralds do not impose their own ideas and preferences on the text, but rather reproduce the authorial intention. Thus, expository preaching should take into account not only the ideas of the text but also its literary/ rhetorical form so that we can say what God says and do what God does. Both are needed. This session lays the foundation for reproducing the content and the impact of God's Holy Word.

Poet Emily Dickinson said, "Tell all the truth, but tell it slant." Sounds like our Lord's use of parables, doesn't it? How can we handle parables in a way that conveys the meaning and impact of this "slant" genre?

Session 4 (9:00-10:00)
Psalms—Listening to the Music

How can we capture the impact of this crafted, artistic, beautiful form of literature? We want to say what the text says and do what it does—move the listener, heighten affect, and lodge in memory with word pictures.

Session 5 (10:00-11:00)
Proverbs—Short Sentences Long
Remembered

Hebrew proverbs are often only six words long. How can expository preachers unpack them? How can we preach theology from these sayings that sound like self-help wisdom?

Session 6 (14:00-15:00) Epistles—Forming a Christian Mind, Living a Christian Life

New Testament epistles may be the closest thing we have to what preaching to believers sounded like in the first century. Let's eavesdrop to see how we should preach in the 21st century.

Session 7 (9:00-10:00) Narrative—Tell Me the Old, Old Story, Part 1

Narrative is the largest genre of Scripture by far. God values story (and so do our listeners!) We will ask what makes story work so well, and then we will suggest how to reproduce those effects in our own sermons.
